

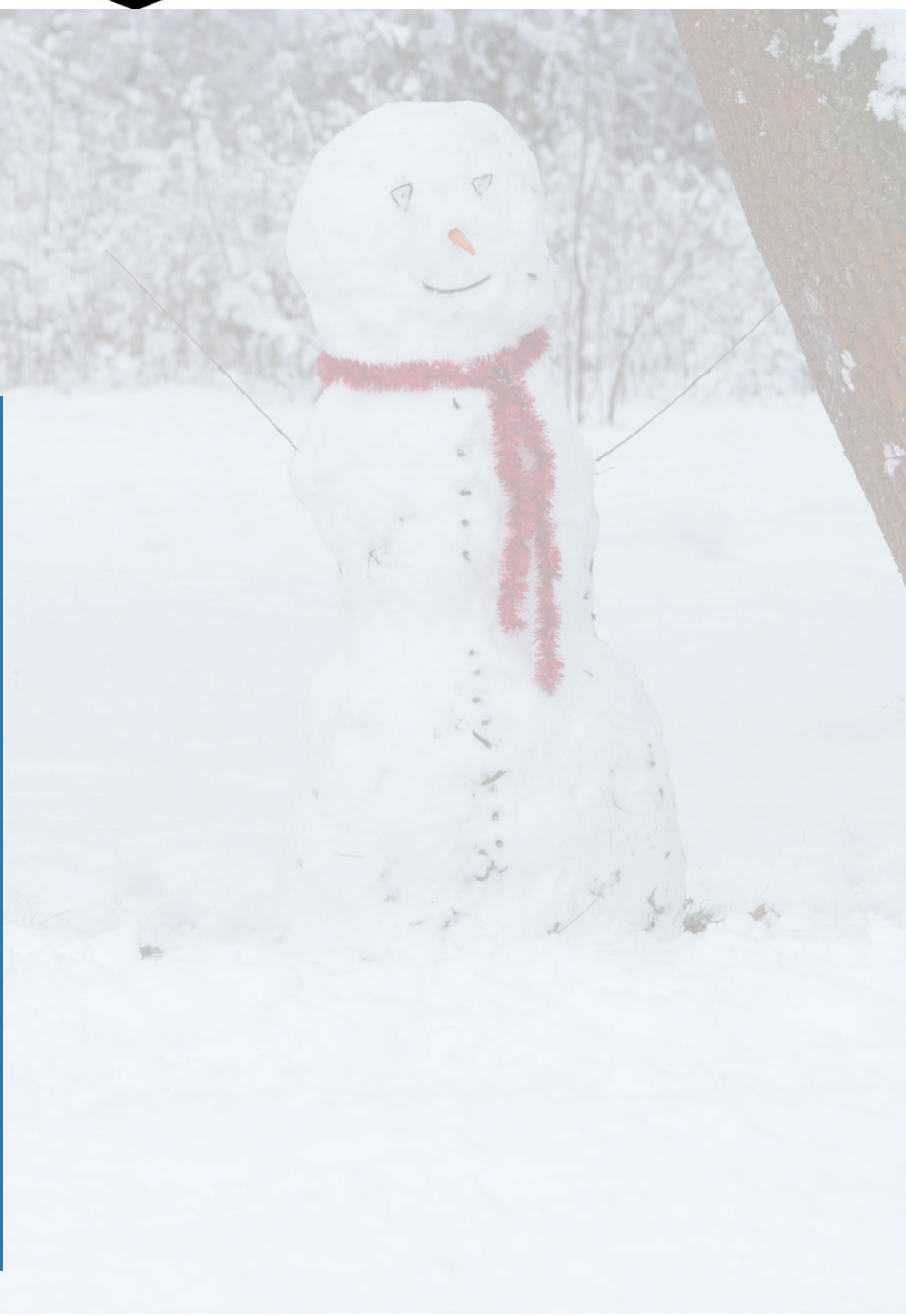

COMMUNITY FIREPIT

Westhill Rink - next to golf course

Extend your stay and play this winter! Community Fire Pits help residents enjoy, stay and play outdoors for longer by offering a warm-up station and an additional light source in the winter months. Fire pits are available from noon to 11 p.m. daily. Residents wishing to use the firepits are asked to bring their own seasoned firewood.



Fire Pit Safety Tips

- Always check if there is a fire ban before starting a fire
- One adult (19+) must be present and in charge of the fire
- Use kindling or newspaper to start the fire safely
 - Do not ignite fire with lighter fluid, gasoline or alcohol
- Use your own clean seasoned firewood or manufactured firelogs
- Do not use trees or park materials in the fire pit
- Keep small children and pets 3 feet away from the fire
- Have a water source to quickly put out the fire, if needed
- Have a first aid kit on hand
- Put out the fire before you leave
- Put litter in designated receptacles or take it home
- Fire Department prohibits the use of portable wood-burning fire pits and fireplaces in all City-owned or regulated spaces, including parks, open areas, outdoor rinks, and school properties.*

*Note: Section 16(3)(a) of the Regina Fire Bylaw currently permits the use of grills and barbecues without an Open-Air Fire Permit, which allows the use of propane-fueled appliances.
